Two Bedroom House Located on Elgin Street

This two bedroom house, just painted by the Tigard Church (pictured on the left) is available for **\$850 a month**. Residents pay their own utilities. TRH pays for garbage and is responsible for the maintenance. This unit has:

- bath and a half
- single car garage
- utility room
- approximately 1100 square feet.

Gracious Living is Still Available in Apartments



One bedroom apartments (one which is pictured above) are approximately 500 square feet. The "Gracious Living" plan is available for these units for \$1,000 a month. This package includes:

- Water, sewer, electricity and garbage
- Maintenance
- One meal a day (spouse: \$150 a month extra)
- Housekeeping (one hour a week)
- Chapel, Bible study, choir, etc
- Christian Fellowship and numerous activities

April 23, 1920 - October 29, 2009

Ed was born and raised in Elizabeth, New Jersey. He served his country during World War II, first patrolling the Pacific Northwest Coast, and then serving in the European Theater, where he received a battlefield commission to 2nd Lieutenant. He retired as a Major and served in the Army Reserve until 1973. During his service in the Northwest, he met his wife, Wilma LaRaut, from Roseburg, Oregon. They were married in Long Beach, Washington, on January 1, 1943. Ed lived in Salem where he worked as a furniture maker, was a guard at the State Penitentiary, then retired from the United States Post Office after 30 years. After his retirement, he enjoyed making wooden toys for his family and friends. Ed and Wilma moved to TRH to an Octaplex in 2007. Ed is survived by his wife, Wilma (who continues to reside at TRH); his children, Edward Moskal, Jr., James Moskal, Angie Bartel and Kathy Cea, seven grandchildren and 15 great-grandchildren. Ed is also survived by his brother, Stan Moskal of Elizabeth, New Jersey.
